### Our new media concept is here !

Dear parents,

In the last two years, KIBS has done a lot in terms of media education and use. For this reason, we have not only updated our media concept but also completely redesigned it. The use of tablets now allows us to make our daily lessons even more action-orientated, creative and individual. In our primary school, we promote logical thinking with Coding in addition to Mathematics. Starting in the coming school year, our pupils in the Secondary will critically and constructively deal with all facets of contemporary media-use in a specially conceptualised subject of Media Studies. In the older year groups, we are incorporating further content from the Computer Science curriculum. All teachers regularly take part in extensive training courses to ensure the pedagogically valuable use of digital media. Additionally, we have intensified our cooperation with Smiley e.V. to offer all interested parents an insight into new developments in the field of media education and to receive assistance in dealing with these advancements.
