The new building is being built on the open space behind the existing building on Paderborner Straße, which KIBS has been using since 2013. Two additional group rooms for the kindergarten, classrooms for the secondary school and a single-field sports hall with ancillary rooms are being built there. The construction work, which is being undertaken by the companies Keding and Hoffmeister, is progressing quickly and the move into the new premises is planned for the end of this year.


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
I think it is important because we should know about history and what happened in the past.

In NTW, year 6 explored the different angles, sizes and sharpness of shadows they created, using hand-made foil figurines.


